Leadership Circle (LC) gifts allow Huckleberry to respond rapidly to emerging youth needs, while maintaining critical existing programming. In the past three years, LC gifts enabled Huckleberry's health education program in Marin to expand its curriculum on consent in intimate relationships. This expansion led a local foundation to partner with Huckleberry in our work to become an expert and resource hub on youth-specific sexualized violence

in Marin County. In San Francisco, private, unrestricted dollars led Huckleberry to initiate Project READY (Reconnecting, Educating, and Achieving Dreams for Youth), a new juvenile justice prevention program that provides important services to eighth graders with behavioral or truancy issues before an initial arrest occurs. This past spring, Huckleberry began strategic visioning for the organization. The Board of Directors and staff came together to create a roadmap that will help to guide the agency for the next three to five years. HUCKLEBERRY'S LEADERSHIP CIRCLE LONG-TERM STRATEGIC IMPACT/GOAL

Approximately one third of our budget fluctuates year to year, due to cycling of multi-year grants, and changes in individual and foundation support. Therefore, the agency needs to raise \$2.5 million dollars (individual, foundation and corporate) to meet our current program needs. Additional funds are needed to support the growth and infrastructure for almost all Huckleberry's programs.

The goal of the LC in the next three years is to increase unrestricted funding to \$1million PER YEAR. This will enable HYP to:

- Make programmatic and administrative decisions based on need, not grant funding cycles;
- Maintain and grow critical health programming, ensure access to free mental health care and substance misuse services:
