Dear Friends of Huckleberry Youth Programs,

I would like to begin this letter by sincerely hoping that you and your loved ones are all well and healthy. The past year has been one fraught with fear, anxiety, grief, and trauma for many of us, and the Huckleberry family extends our deepest appreciation for your continued support.

The 2019/2020 fiscal year was a particularly notable and challenging year for Huckleberry Youth Programs, as we rapidly adjusted programming to meet the needs of youth and families during the COVID-19 pandemic. Our incredible staff swiftly implemented health guidance from the WHO, CDC, and local government officials to adapt and adjust services in response to changing government guidelines.

Working with clients and partners in ways that we never before envisioned, Huckleberry maintained virtually all of our critical services for youth and families. Even during this unprecedented time, Huckleberry continues to be a crucial part of the safety net for our Bay Area community. In many ways, our services are needed now more than ever before.

As you'll see in the enclosed report, we pivoted many of our essential services, including health education workshops, college access programming, support for commercially sexually exploited youth, and mental health services to virtual platforms, providing therapy, case management, and weekly meetings for youth in a safe, remote, and accessible way.

At Huckleberry, we firmly believe that youth have immense strengths and resilience; but the past fiscal year has shone a bright light on racial injustice and the systemic barriers our youth and families face in accessing resources and opportunities to reach their full potential. Huckleberry Youth Programs will continue to be a safe space for ALL folx. We will continue to meet youth and families where they are, empowering them with access to knowledge, skills, and resources to develop stronger ties, self-advocate, and create a more equitable and just community.

During this difficult time, one thing has remained clear: we could not continue to build a healthy, strong, and vibrant community without the generosity of our wonderful donors. You have risen up for our youth like never before. Huckleberry's staff and Board of Directors extend heartfelt gratitude for your continued contributions.

Huckleberry House

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Huckleberry modified all of its programming to ensure the health and safety of our youth, families, and staff. Huckleberry implemented the health guidance from the WHO, CDC, and local government officials and will continue to adapt and adjust services in response to changing government guidelines.

Huckleberry House, our San Francisco-based runaway youth shelter, deemed an essential service, has remained open since the shelter-in-place orders began to deliver critical support for young people experiencing challenging situations at home.

Huckleberry Advocacy & Response Team (HART)

The Huckleberry Advocacy & Response Team's (HART) dedicated staff have been working remotely during the pandemic, but continue to respond to crisis calls in-person to establish a more trusting and meaningful connection with young people at the start of accessing our sensitive services for commercially sexually exploited children (CSEC).





HEALTH

Huckleberry **therapists and counselors**, who are embedded into all of Huckleberry's programs, now **engage clients in telehealth** through telephone and video appointments.

Huckleberry's health education team has created interactive online recordings of health education workshops to inform youth about physical health and healthy decision making.

Prior to the pandemic, Huckleberry Youth Health Center became one of only six key access points to offer the Coordinated Entry for Youth Program to all San Francisco youth facing homelessness.

Even during the shelter-in-place, Huckleberry continued to provide housing assessments, counseling, and housing referrals through phone, virtual, and limited in-person appointments based on a youth's individual needs. **Huckleberry was able to house youth temporarily in San Francisco hotel rooms during the pandemic and in some cases, assist youth with finding permanent housing.**

Huckleberry's CARC

After providing arrested youth with virtual programming during the shelter-in-place, Huckleberry's Community Assessment & Resource Center (CARC) reopened to provide in-person services for arrested youth in June 2020. CARC is one community-based program credited with reducing juvenile detention bookings by 75%, resulting in the monumental upcoming closure of San Francisco's Juvenile Hall.

The Hall's pending closure is progress towards racial equity and an opportunity for Huckleberry and our community to develop restorative justice practices that uplift justice-systems-involved youth and heal communities - an effective alternative to policing.

Huckleberry's Director of Youth Justice, Denise Coleman, is a key member in a collaborative working group to develop an appropriate community response to Juvenile Hall's closure.

Project READY

Project READY tackles the school-to-prison pipeline by providing youth with potential for academic success with mental health services, case management, and family support.

An independent third party evaluation concluded that Huckleberry's Project READY (Reconnecting, Educating, and Achieving Dreams for Youth), is successful at delivering high-quality, youth-centered programming in schools.

HUCKLEBERRY ACE ACADEMY (Access to College Equity)

Thanks to a grant from the Taproot Foundation, Huckleberry staff members were connected with pro bono marketing staff from Adobe to rename the former Huckleberry Wellness Academy. **The new name, HUCKLEBERRY ACE** (Access to College Equity) ACADEMY, better reflects the program's mission of providing first-generation college students in Marin County with workforce development and opportunities in post-secondary education.

In 2020, Huckleberry ACE Academy used a variety of activities, breakout rooms, and engaging visual materials during virtual weekly skill-building workshops and college and career access programming for students.

Huckleberry ACE also developed a "college trip" portal so youth can safely visit postsecondary institutions virtually.


