We are very pleased to announce that Huckleberry Youth Programs recently completed our next strategic plan! This multi-year process has allowed us to evaluate our current position and develop a formal plan to guide Huckleberry and our programs into a strong future.

We collaborated with Venture Leadership Collective to facilitate this process, and received input from clients, donors, staff, board, and other partners in creating the plan. The aim of the strategic plan is to prioritize areas of focus, key activities, and measurable goals that will lead Huckleberry Youth Programs through the next several years, as well as help us realize our vision and intended long-term impact.

Through this process, we developed a Theory of Change, allowing us to take a deeper dive into our connection to the Bay Area community, the youth we serve and our partner organizations, critical programmatic components, and program data and evaluation.

The process has also resulted in a revised mission statement for Huckleberry, which we feel provides greater clarity of our programs' intended impact. We are thrilled to share it with you here:

RECENT HUCKLEBERRY HIGHLIGHTS:

Huckleberry was awarded a "Stop the Hate" grant (\$625,000 over two years) to provide support and services to victims of hate crimes, survivors, and their families, and to facilitate hate incident or hate crime prevention measures. The grant will allow Huckleberry to hire three more staff to provide support services in San Francisco and Marin to youth victims of hate incidents and hate crimes.


In the fall of 2023, more than 3,600 community members in Marin County voted on how to spend \$2.5 million in public funds to advance equity. Twenty-four nonprofit projects were on the ballot and voters were able to choose their top seven projects. Through the efforts of community voters, the Huckleberry ACE (Access to College Equity) Academy received a \$250,000 grant over two years.

San Rafael City Schools selected **Huckleberry as an Outstanding Community Partner** for our work providing mental health support in school Wellness Centers. health education workshops, and groups for Newcomer students. Huckleberry was recognized for being, "a pillar in the Bay Area for over 50 years and in Marin County for over 30 years. Huckleberry's dedication and passion to serve youth is incomparable... they have been the adolescent experts that our District and community highly respect and trust will have our students' best interests in mind."

SAFETY

Young people who leave home prematurely have a higher incidence of permanent homelessness and job inconsistency. Homelessness negatively impacts educational attainment, health issues, and job futures. Without youth shelters, runaway and unstably housed youth would end up in juvenile detention centers, child welfare systems, emergency rooms, or permanently on the street at significant costs to taxpayers.

Huckleberry House provides emergency shelter, support, and family counseling to youth who are abused, runaway or homeless.

In FY23, 91% of youth sheltered at Huckleberry House exited to safe housing, including family reunification, living with a relative, or alternative safe living environments.

HUCKLEBERRY HOUSE

161 youth received crisis intervention counseling

87 youth received overnight shelter at Huckleberry house

98% of sheltered clients with safe/stable families received family reunification services or returned safely to their families

HUCKLEBERRY ADVOCACY & RESPONSE TEAM (HART)

HART provides comprehensive, trauma-informed support and advocacy services for youth who are vulnerable to or experiencing commercial sexual exploitation, involved in sex trafficking, or engaging in survival sex.

48 exploited youth and youth at risk of commercial sexual exploitation received emergency response and case management

HEALTH

HUCKLEBERRY MENTAL HEALTH AND FAMILY SUPPORT SERVICES

In a 2021 study, the CDC reported that 42% of students felt persistently sad or hopeless and more than 1 in 5 students reported seriously considering suicide. Untreated trauma, anxiety, and depression leads to impaired long term mental health, lower life satisfaction, increased medical issues, and an increased likelihood of substance abuse and addiction.

Huckleberry's mental health services help young people to recover from trauma, address mood challenges, and develop healthy relationships.

In FY23, 71% of youth receiving counseling through Huckleberry reported improvement in well-being.

436 youth in SF and Marin received mental health services and supports

HUCKLEBERRY YOUTH HEALTH CLINICS IN SAN FRANCISCO & MARIN

493 youth accessed primary, sexual and/or reproductive services at Huckleberry Health Clinics

3,710 youth attended Health Education Workshops in San Francisco and Marin





JUSTICE

HUCKLEBERRY'S CARC

(Community Assessment & Resource Center)

Seventy percent of youth arrested in California are rearrested within one year, costing our society in dollars and missed opportunities for youth.

Huckleberry's CARC diverts over one-third of San Francisco arrested youth from detention and probation, assesses their situation, and re-engages them in their community to prevent further justice system involvement.

222 arrested youth were provided community-based juvenile justice diversion services

780/o of CARC clients were not re-arrested within the year following program completion

PROJECT READY

(Reconnecting, Educating, and Achieving Dreams for Youth)

Huckleberry's Project READY partners with students with behavioral and truancy concerns, the majority of whom are enrolled at Martin Luther King, Jr. and Willie L. Brown, Jr. Middle Schools and are from neighborhoods that are disproportionately experiencing/witnessing community violence, poverty, and trauma, to successfully transition to high school and avoid arrest.

39 youth engaged with Project READY and as a result, avoided contact with the juvenile justice system

100% of program participants remained in school and arrest-free through the 9th grade

EDUCATION

San Rafael High School's overall graduation rate is over 90%, yet the graduation rate for Latinx students is 73% and only one-third of Latinx graduates completed UC/CSU prerequisites.

HUCKLEBERRY'S ACE (Access to College Equity) ACADEMY

Huckleberry's ACE Academy provides the necessary skills for high school students, who will be among the first in their families to attend college, to successfully graduate from high school and attend post-secondary school.

In FY23, 100% of ACE seniors graduated high school and are now attending college.


